Over a live stream, Krasinski invited his "The Office" co-star Rainn Wilson and popular music artists The Jonas Brothers, Chance the Rapper and Billie Eilish. Despite facing some technical difficulties, the musicians performed their most popular songs for quarantined seniors, and addressed the unfortunate situation. Nick Jonas, the lead singer of the Jonas brothers, commented on the live stream that "we [The Jonas Brothers] want to share this experience with everyone staying safe at home, we could potentially do one of our songs if that's alright, try to turn this party up a notch."

While the live stream may not have been what seniors had dreamed of, the celebrity guest stars had a dance party on-screen, decked out in their formal attire to mimic the aspects of a true high school prom. Krasinksi even joked that, while seniors' family members would reminisce about a different kind of prom, that at least the Class of 2020 could respond with, "Oh really? Did Billie Eilish play your prom? Did the Jonas Brothers play your prom? Did Chance the Rapper pop into your prom? And did Rainn Wilson ruin your prom?"

Krasinski also video chatted with a high school senior and her dad from Alabama, whose "living room prom" recently went viral on social media. The family explained that when Marli Odgers' senior prom was cancelled, her dad took it upon himself to throw her a prom in their living room, slow-dancing with his daughter in lieu of her date. On the video call, Krasinski asked if the Odgers' family would attend his prom, and help him to DJ. During the prom itself,

the dad and daughter shared yet another dance, to the music of the Jonas brothers over the livestream.

Towards the end of the night, the actor took a more serious tone, commenting that "We are all going through this together," he shared, "This is a very, very weird time but each and every one of you are missing something and this is the least I could do." His Youtube series will continue to produce fun and informative segments, such as cooking or dancing videos, celebrity Zoom calls, and even a virtual graduation, as the pandemic continues.
